To help get more people to classes the club is starting a new marketing campaign. The pictures above show the front and back of our new business cards. All members are encouraged to take at least 2 cards each and hand them out to family and friends. On the back of the card is a number for people to quote to get a 10% discount. This is where you put your member number. If someone enrolls in a class and quotes the number, they will receive a 10% discount and you will get \$10 added to your pre-pay account. You can take as many cards as you like. If you hand out 50 cards and 10 people quote your number when enrolling in a class you will get \$100 added to your PP. There is no limit to the number of cards you take and no limit to how much you can get.

## Hand of the Month

From the final round of the ANOT Qualifying.

Board 27, Dealer: S, Nil Vul

Focus on South for a moment. Do you open 2C or with one of a black suits. When the bidding at our table went 2C <pass> 2D (0 or 1 control). Then East bid 3D. What now for South?

If you bid 4D over this, you are on the right track, if partner bids 4S, do you press on?

Strangely enough if you bid 1S as South, partner will raise you to 4S. Now bidding 6S looks sensible, and this auction occurred a number of times.

More than half of the ANOT field reached 6S, the datum was +940.

7D was an excellent save for East-West. Strangely, only two pairs bid this. One pair was doubled in 7D and conceded just 300 points. The other triumphed by pushing the opponents to 7S, one off, although -300 would still have yielded a good result.

Would your partnership have reached 6S? Sadly for two pairs, 6C was an unlucky choice with the hideous trump break creating a second loser.

You may think that the diamond suit is a straight guess, but bridge is a percentage game. Those who take the Queen off dummy are playing for the J to be a singleton in the South hand. The one player who laid down the Ace as the first play in diamonds was playing for a singleton King in *either* hand – the latter is twice as likely and therefore the superior play. The hand was played 5 times in the regular duplicate. Two pairs were allowed to play in 6H, (one doubled), and three pairs pressed on to 6S, making only once.

By contrast, in the supervised section, the auctions reflected the lack of experience with freakish hands and only one table out of seven ventured past the 5 level. The pair who played successfully in 6H, doubled, was rewarded with a top board.

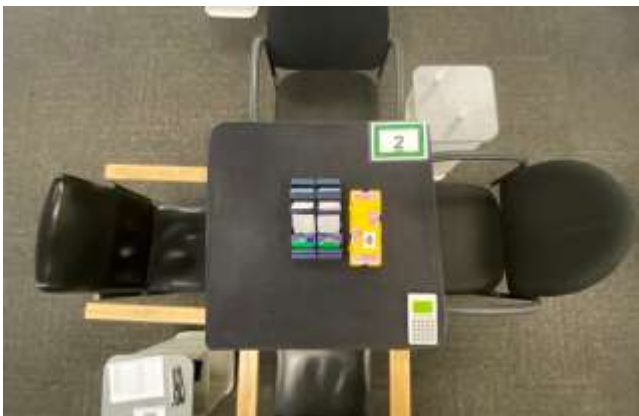

## **New Coffee Machine for the Front Lounge (Still waiting!! Please be patient)**

The committee has approved the purchase of a new coffee machine for the front lounge. The old machine has been in the lounge for over 8 years and in that time has dispensed over 33,000 cups of coffee. The new machine uses fresh long life milk suitable for coffee machines and will also offer members the choice of hot chocolate. The self cleaning, low maintenance features will ensure the reliability of the machine. It will have credit card facility (not shown), which eliminates the

need to handle and process cash. The display is programmable to enable members to see coming events at the club whilst they are waiting for their drink. The steamer unit shown will not be provided. The cost of a cup of coffee/chocolate will rise to \$2.50 to cover the cost of the credit card transaction fee. Not bad considering the price for the coffee has not increased in the last 8 years. The new machine should be installed in the coming weeks.
